Guidelines for income-based eligibility determinations for Title IB youth and adult program services authorized under the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act of 2014 (WIOA)

PURPOSE

To provide CEOs, Local Boards, Admin Entity Staff, and Case Managers with updated guidelines for income-based eligibility determinations for WIOA Title IB youth and adult program services



CHANGES

Table 1 has been revised to correct income thresholds for families of 1 and 2 in Nebraska's metro and non-metro areas. Note that the effective date for use of the revised income thresholds remains as April 21, 2022.

ACTION

Effective April 21, 2022, income guidelines described in this Notice must be used by Case Managers when determining whether youth and adults are *low-income individuals* for purposes of income-based eligibility for Title IB youth and adult program services. For purposes of this Notice, a *low-income individual* is an individual whose total annual family income does not exceed the higher of the *poverty line or* 70 percent of the *lower living standard income level* (LLSIL).¹

NOTICE

The US Department of Health and Human Services published 2022 poverty-level guidelines in the Federal Register on January 21, 2022, Vol. 87, No. 14 (pages 3,315 – 3,316). The US Department of Labor (USDOL) simultaneously announced the availability LLSILs for 2022² in the Federal Register on January 21, 2022, Vol. 87, No. 14 (pages 3,315 – 3,216). Further, the USDOL Employment and Training Administration announced on April 6, 2022 the availability of its calculated poverty level/LLSIL tables. Table 1 below provides income guidelines Case Managers must follow when determining income-based eligibility for Title IB youth and adult program services.
