Tutoring, study skills training, instruction and evidence-based dropout prevention and recovery strategies that lead to completion of the requirements for a: a. high school diploma or its recognized equivalent (including a recognized certificate of attendance or similar document for individuals with disabilities); or b. recognized postsecondary credential
- 2. Alternative secondary school services (such as basic education skills training, individualized academic instruction, and English as a Second Language training) or dropout recovery services (such as credit recovery, counseling, and educational plan development)
- 3. Paid and unpaid work experiences that have academic and occupational education as a component of the work experience, which <u>may</u> include the following types of work experiences:
